

TEMPORARY RENTAL SUBSIDY PROGRAM OVERVIEW

What is the Temporary Rental Subsidy Program?

The Temporary Rental Subsidy Program is a new program offered by Pike County Human Services.

It is a new way to help low- to moderate-income renters in Pike County through a monthly rental subsidy, case management, and financial counseling.

Do I qualify for
the program?

You may qualify for the program if you:

Rent a house or apartment in Pike County.

Pay more than 30% of your monthly income toward housing costs.

Have income less than 100% of the area median (\$88,188 for a family of 4).

Participants receive a monthly subsidy so that they pay no more than 30% of their monthly income toward housing costs – up to \$500 per month for 12 months.

Temporary Rental Subsidy

Case Management

Participants are required to attend quarterly case management meetings to set goals and to follow a plan to reach their goals.

Goals may focus on employment, housing, childcare, transportation, and financial planning.

Financial Counseling

Participants are required to participate in quarterly financial counseling sessions.

You will work toward a goal like saving money, paying down debt, or increasing income.

your application, she will contact you.**

What information am I required to provide for the application?

You will be asked to provide the following attachments, as applicable to your circumstances:

- Driver's license/identification card for all household members
- 3 months of checking/savings account statements for all household members
- Birth certificate of all household members
- Insurance cards for all household members
- Tax return
- Wages/paystubs for all household members
- UE/SSI
- PPW – FD stamp/cash
- Regular monthly bills
- Eviction notice
- Lease
- Mortgage statement

Do I need to be
